Local **beefsteak tomatoes** are perfectly ripened and delicious.

Super sweet **sungold cherry tomatoes** from Lois Produce are great in your summer salads.



Washington State **cherries** are the biggest, sweetest and best of the season!

Zucchini and yellow squash are coming in at a steady pace.

Local growers expect zucchini supplies to tighten, but prices are great right now.



Green bean prices have dropped considerably. Growers in New York were fortunate to escape the extreme temperatures we had here.



Consequently, the supply is ample and the quality is great.

Canadian **red cabbage** is newly available, and the heads are gigantic.



Green cabbage from New York and New Jersey is in great supply for cole slaw and other summer salads.



Cool **cucumbers** from the North are pristine, and prices are excellent.



Eggplants from New Jersey are plentiful, causing prices to be very reasonable.



Mesculin and baby spinach are readily available.



Shippers are moving to central California for these sweet, juicy **grapes**. We are seeing lots of very plump juicy varieties of both red seedless and green grapes. The clusters are amazingly tight and the prices are just what we like to see at this time of year.

Spanish and red onion markets have stabilized, due to increased production volume in California and New Mexico.



Strawberry and raspberry prices are up slightly due to



higher demand. There has been little change in the price or availability of **oranges**.



Watch

This will likely be the last week for gigantic **blackberries** from Westmoreland Berry Farms.



The markets for **iceberg lettuce** remain strong.



Jumbo **asparagus** sizes are very difficult to source, and prices are considerably



higher with cool temperatures in growing areas.



Idaho potato prices continue to rise, as demand exceeds supply.



Broccoli and cauliflower supplies are ample, causing prices to be steady.



Red and yellow pepper prices are relatively unchanged this week.



Carrot and celery markets are uneventful.



Crenshaw, canary and orange-flesh honeydew melons are in season.



Watermelon supplies are tight, with higher than usual demand.



Cantaloupe markets are active with the new crop harvests just beginning. Much of the increase in cost for **cantaloupes and honeydews** is due to freight.



Figs' availability is sporadic, but is expected to improve when new harvests begin in a week.



Pear supplies will remain tight until domestic harvest is underway.
