Cherries: The first California cherries have hit the market but prices are very high.

Limes: Pricing has improved greatly!

Artichokes: Great quality on all sizes, minimal availability on baby size.



Asparagus: Besides beautiful local asparagus, both Washington state and Peru are shipping, with favorable pricing.

Iceberg. Romaine & Romaine Hearts: Very good pricing; all from California.

Brussels Sprouts: Steady buy all around!

Rain alert: Multiple days of pounding rain have severely impacted Eastern farm production. Workers are prohibited from getting into fields to pick leading to sporadic outages.

Tomatoes: In the midst of the Florida Palmetto/ Ruskin production, unrelenting rain hit the fields severely limiting the harvesting process. Prices doubled in one week.

Watermelon: Same wet scenario is causing havoc with the watermelon crop. Prices are up but quality is good.

Blueberries: Coming from both Mexico and Georgia with good quality but prices are up significantly.

Local Strawberries: A week of rain has not been good for local berries. Supplies are now hit or miss.

Broccoli, Broccoli Crowns & Cauliflower:

Prices have spiked up significantly.

Red & Green Leaf & Boston lettuce:

Accelerated demand, especially for **green leaf** lettuce. Prices are still very high.
